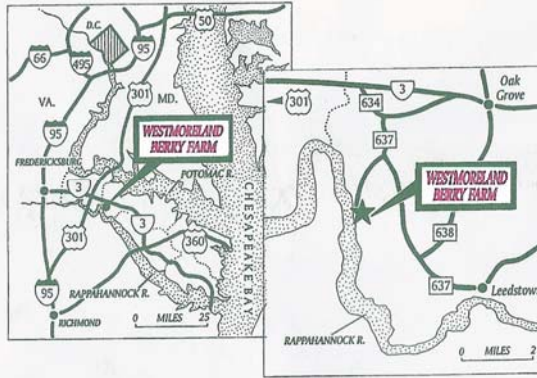

Westmoreland Berry Farm

The historic property was originally patented along the Rappahannock River in 1641. In 1803, the plantation was known as LEESVILLE. During the Civil War, the plantation home above the English style terraces was bombed and burned by Union gun boats.

Upon arrival at the hilltop farm market visitors will note the tremendous view of the orchards, berry gardens, and the Rappahannock River alongside.

At the Farm Market information on pick your own berries and availability of ready picked crops is available, as well as food, farm produce, farm made preserves, and gift baskets.

In 1995, a land donation by the Voorhees family to The Nature Conservancy of an adjoining natural area created The Voorhees Nature Preserve. The Nature Preserve trails are accessible upon check in at the farm market.

The present staff, consisting of up to 45 dedicated workers during peak season, work nearly round the clock to present a selection of quality products, with a focus on superior service to each customer. Visit the farm daily from Mid-Spring through December, and by appointment otherwise. We look forward to seeing you!

Fruit Care

All fresh fruit is highly perishable. Handle each piece gently. Never pack fruit tightly together. Do not leave fruit in direct sunlight, especially in a closed car. Store fresh fruit in a cool place. Sort and gently rinse fruit only when ready to use. DO NOT remove strawberry caps before washing. (Remember that they should be picked with caps on.)

Weather Conditions

The farm is the source of the freshest fruit. For the farmer, much is dependent on "Mother Nature" for supply, availability, and when fruit is ripe. Weather conditions the previous year often affect harvest dates of crops months later. To avoid disappointment, please call ahead or check our web site for an update on your favorite crop's availability!

Product Guarantee

Serving our customers with quality and selection of farm fresh fruit is a demanding challenge with the climate of the Mid Atlantic region. Your satisfaction is important, and we will honor a 24 hour return or telephone call guarantee for an exchange, providing the customer has done all aspects of good fruit care. Integrated Pest Management

Many plant pests, including insects, bacteria, and molds, love fruit crops also. The responsibility of providing wholesome fruit and protecting the crops is taken very seriously at Westmoreland Berry Farm. An Integrated Pest Management Program on the farm emphasizes prevention and early season control of pests. This allows a minimal number of crop protectant applications per season. Specific inquiries to the management are welcomed.
